All Children Need Health Coverage that is Affordable, Comprehensive, and Simple.

Health Coverage for Connecticut's Children:

- 57,000 children are uninsured (6.6% of all children).
- 267,551 children are enrolled in Medicaid.
- 21,033 children are enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). ***

How affordable is health coverage for Connecticut's children? †

- CHIP eligibility is up to 300 percent of poverty (\$67,050 for a family of four)
- Medicaid eligibility is 185 percent of poverty (\$41,348)

How simple are enrollment procedures in CHIP and Medicaid for Connecticut's children?

- Simplification procedures:
 - Administrative verification of income
 - No face-to-face interview
 - No asset test
 - Joint application
 - Presumptive eligibility for Medicaid—so children do not have to wait for their application to be processed before seeing a doctor
- Barriers that remain:
 - No presumptive eligibility for children in CHIP—which forces children to wait until their application is processed before they can see a doctor.
 - No 12-month continuous eligibility
 - 2 month waiting period
